



Egypt-Japan Education Partnership

Early Childhood Education



JOCV

For nurseries in Egypt, JICA supports improving the quality of Early Childhood Education, which will in turn promote the healthy upbringing for Egyptian children through the dissemination of concepts such as "Learning through Play."

Basic Education



For Egypt's basic education (including kindergartens), which has an overemphasis on academic ability, JICA aims to foster independence, cooperativeness, sociability and discipline, by introducing Japanese-style of education: "Whole Child Education Model" known as "Tokkatsu+".

Technical Education



For Egypt's technical schools, where graduates are faced with a low rate of employment, in collaboration with local Japanese companies, JICA supports developing valuable and employable graduates by introducing practical technical education.

Higher Education



Egypt-Japan University of Science and Technology (E-JUST) is expected to foster human resources who contribute to the development of industry and society in Middle East and African countries as well as Egypt. In addition to the existing graduate school, JICA is supporting the undergraduate program which newly opened in 2017.

Overseas Study / Training





JICA supports developing human resources by welcoming at least 2,500 Egyptians to Japan during a five-year period.

Research at the Egypt-Japan University of Science and Technology (E-JUST), aimed at the practical application of robotic probes used in disasters (Technical Cooperation).

Tourism Development

Japanese technologies are being utilized through technical cooperation for the conservation and restoration of Egyptian cultural properties. JICA has trained more than 2,000 people through various training programs.



Through the GEM Joint Conservation Project, Japanese and Egyptian Experts are working jointly for the conservation, restoration and transportation of the key artifacts to be displayed at the new museum.
