- ↓ Limits of globalization?

 2016 World trade of merchandises: +1.3%. 1st time since 2001 lower increase than World GDP (WTO)
- ↓ New protectionism (in the West only?) and limits of further liberalization?
- ↑ More intra-regional trade / less international trade?
- ↑ Africa growth (and India). Towards a 3 billion population continent?
- ↑ Re-shoring (less than expected, labor costs are not so important any more) ?
- ↑ Automotive industry increase worldwide / decline in Europe ?

 Production by region: 1970 →2018 / Europe 45M →25 M / Asia Pacific 20 M→55 M
- → Relocation, 3D printing, miniaturization, dematerialization?
- ↓ The future axes of world maritime transport: Intra Asia and Far East Africa?

"Doubling the maximum container ship over the last decade has reduced total vessel costs per transported container by roughly a third. However, these cost savings are decreasing with size; the cost savings of the newest generation of containerships are 4 to 6 times smaller than the savings from the previous round of upsizing. Approximately 60% of the cost savings of the most recent container ships are related to more efficient engines and not to scale".

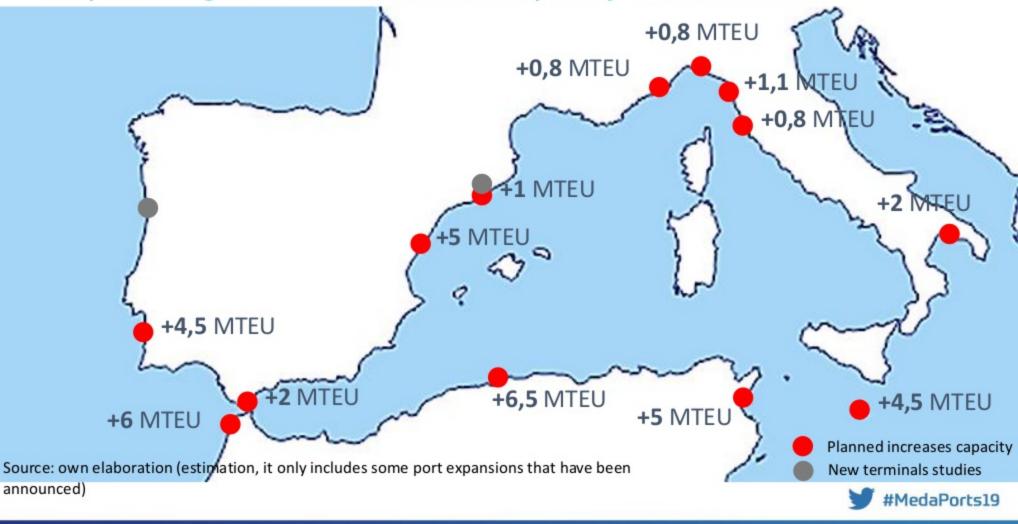








Espected growth in container capacity in West Med



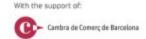
















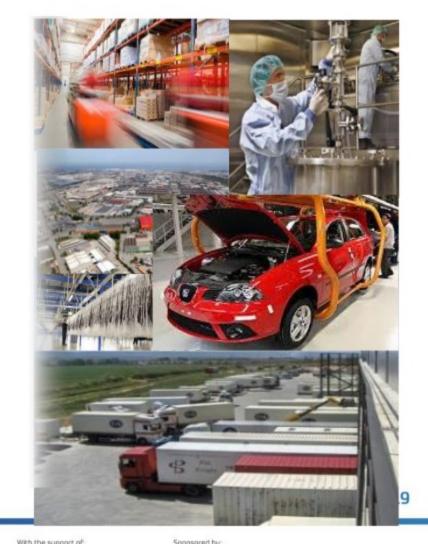

Carrefour

In ZAL Barcelona they have 2 logistics warehouses: a dry one of 44.000 m2 and a cold one of 17,000 m2.

LIDL

Logistics platform for the Iberian Peninsula in Moncada i Reixac (Barcelona) and a warehouse of 36,000 m2 in ZAL Barcelona.

AMAZON

Amazon has a new logistics center of 63.000 m2 in El Prat de Llobregat (Barcelona). The center is a part of its European network.

Schneider Electric

Schneider Electric has an integrated logistics centre in Sant Boi del Llobregat (greater area of Barcelona).

HONDA Logistics

Factory & logistics center in Santa Perpetua de la Mogoda (Barcelona) for distributing Spain & Portugal & Morocco

MAZDA

Car imports from Japan through the Port of Barcelona to be distributed to other Mediterranean countries.

Decathlon

In ZAL Barcelona they have their logistics center of 50.000 m2 for stock management & for sport materials delivery to their warehouses and shops in Europe.

Nissan SEAT

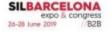
Their factories are in Barcelona from where they distribute their cars by road, rail and sea, all over the world.

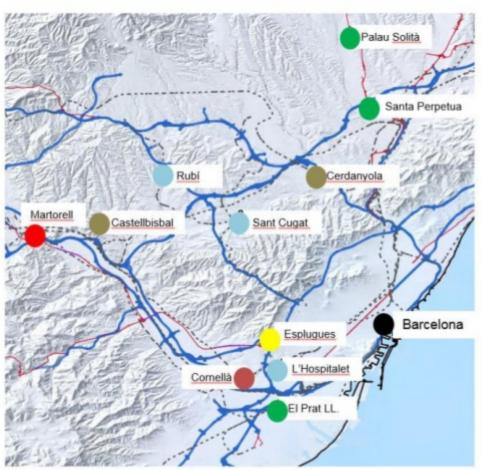

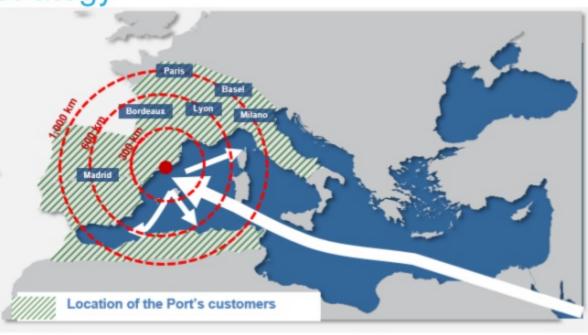

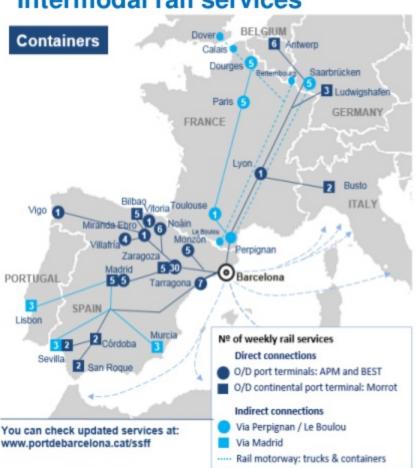
